

This is 15 minutes before we serve the meals. People come in early so they can shop for the extras we offer and also look at the clothing. They are so thankful for anything they are given.

Thursday Night Takeout Meals at Trinity take place every Thursday from 5:30–6:30 pm. This outreach program began on May 20, 2021. Over the past two years, we have served 4,718 meals. Wow! Thank you to the many people who have contributed to this mission by volunteering to serve, and through food and monetary donations. The Midwest Food Bank continues to generously support this project. We look forward to continuing this mission at Trinity. We are grateful to be able to serve our community with the faithful help of our volunteers: Judy Krovic, Matt Krovic, Jan Holwig, Ed Holwig, Zach Szekeres, Shelley Radic, Barb Kain, Nancy Paine, and Pastor Chad.

We could always use more cooks and helpers for our meals. The number of meals that we serve each Thursday has steadily increased. Through the help of the **Fellowship Committee**, we have a rotation of cooks who are willing to prepare meals. St. Peters Middletown is also part of this rotation, generously providing meals. If you would be willing to bake casseroles or prepare a meal to feed approximately 80 people, let us know. Through our food bank source, we can often provide for you rice, beans, pastas, spaghetti sauce, chicken patties, sausages, vegetables, boxed potatoes, crushed tomatoes, applesauce, potato chips/snacks, and various other ingredients to supplement the meals you prepare. If anyone from either Trinity or St. Peters would be willing to help in serving or preparing food for these meals, please contact Jim or Sandy Canning at 717-652-3493 or sandycanning@verizon.net. You may volunteer when it fits your schedule.

Many of the people who take out meals on Thursdays make use of the **Food Pantry** available to them in our social hall. Paper products (toilet paper, paper towels, and tissues) continue to be popular. 


Sunday Morning Bible Study
