WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH RENEWED IN GRACE?

Dear Friends,

Thank you \bigwedge for the warm welcome and partnership you have offered to me since my arrival in June.

It has been a whirlwind of familiarizing myself with the ministry and discerning the future for Renewed in Grace. From former pastors to current leadership, there has been enormous openness shared with me about the hope and vision for the ministry, in addition to some trepidation and grief. I see it as my task to work with the leadership to ease fear anxiety, and grief while weaving together the vision of God has given while aligning gifts and resources to support that vision. I truly believe that God never asks the church to do something without providing the means to accomplish it. In the case of Renewed in Grace the resources are plentiful.

For starters, there is a clear commitment to the ministry. That commitment isn't about mere survival or wanting to keep the doors open for the eventuality of hosting a funeral. The commitment by the leadership of Renewed in Grace is truly a commitment to Christ and God's desire to serve lovingly. That kind of faith is awesome and bodes well for the future. It also is the ground from which we can grow \(\gamma\). Faith, that is, trust in God means that there needn't be fear while God is leading and prodding. *continued on page 2*

Pastor's Letter continued...

Renewed in Grace has been given **Christocentric (Christ-centered)** leadership. People who want to pray and serve. There is always room for growth, and the changes that may happen or will happen or have happened will provoke such growth. There is an expression that God afflicts the comfortable and comforts the afflicted. It is important to not become comfortable and complacent in faith. The Holy Spirit who imputes faith into our hearts is FIRE and WIND . So, with the Spirit comes inevitable movement and change.

God has also given Renewed in Grace **a broad field for service.** Right now we are spread thinly \leftrightarrow between Steelton and Highspire. The Councils will be considering a number of recommendations from the Consolidation Task Force at a specially called joint Council meeting on August 21 st. Many of those recommendations are the beginning of consolidating energy and resources to focus the ministry, and clarify the mission field.

God has supported the ministry with **solid hard-working and caring staff. Steve Strauss and Arthur Berg** are faithful, reliable and excellent leadership for worship, and I am truly thankful for their gifts.

Additionally, those who have offered their musical gifts have been amazing and given enriching offerings to the worship experience. It is exciting to see and work alongside such talented people. I hope we can build upon their offerings by encouraging new people to join them.

God has given the ministry a bounty of tangible resources. From baskets , to craft supplies , to tables and chairs , to holy spaces, to instruments, to A/V technologies (and those who use them), to money , and so much more - too much to name. **Richard Deutsch and John Michtich** are super special gifts to the houses of worship . They have taken such immense care of the facilities that it is inconceivable to abandon either of them. Eventually, one of our facilities may not be used for worship anymore, and that is a difficult reality worthy of grief. However, what it means is that resources may be redirected toward our contemporary ministry. After all, congregations only serve for a season. For example, none of the apostle Paul's churches still exist, but the faith they engendered does.

It is important that we keep our eyes •• on the cross † as the whirlwind • of the Spirit swirls around and through us;

moving us, changing us, growing us

So we can move,

Change,

And grow the kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven.

To paraphrase the words of a member: **Renewed in Grace is striving to be the hands** ♠, **heart** ♥, **and voice** ♠ **of God to bring a little heaven to earth.** Let us pray.

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Joint Presidential Letter-Renewed in Grace (RIG) Co-op, St. Peter's, Trinity

Time is certainly going by fast this year. We feel like we blinked, and summer is almost over, which means it's time to write this letter for the fall newsletter.

A lot has happened since our last newsletter. Pastor Liz joined us as our intentional interim pastor and since then the following things have occured:

- **RIG Co-op check:** On June 30, during the Sunday service, we had a straw poll to check how everyone feels about the co-op. Everyone had the opportunity to indicate if they felt very positive about (Yah!), sort of positive (Sure), a little negative (Meh), or very negative (Boo). Of those who were present 68% said they felt very positive, 21% said they felt sort of positive, 11% said they felt a little negative, and no one said they felt very negative. That is an amazing indication that the members of this faith community feel good about us together. This gives us hope for our future together.
- **RIG Co-op Secretary:** The first week of July was a time of transition from Jen Kemper as Co-op Secretary to Jan Holwig as acting Co-op Secretary. Jan is enthusiastically embracing the substitute role. Pastor Liz and the leadership of the congregation councils are working on what our needs will be for the future of this role. Many thanks to Jan for her willingness to serve the Co-op.
- Consolidation Task Force: The task force had a very long meeting, filled with spirit-led discussions and resulted in 10 recommendations for the three councils (Renewed in Grace Co-op, St. Peter's, and Trinity) to consider. The councils will prayerfully consider these recommendations. Once they meet and make decisions based on those recommendations, more will be communicated to the congregations of Renewed in Grace.
- **Highspire UMC** The congregation of Highspire UMC is now at the point where they cannot afford to maintain their current building. Based on one of the recommendations from the Consolidation Task Force, the Co-op Council will be meeting with representatives from their congregation to discern how we can help them. This may simply be walking with them and sitting with them as they close. Please keep them in your prayers.

As you can see from the items above, the Consolidation Task Force, Pastor Liz, and the leadership of the three councils are working hard to discern what comes next for the Co-op.

When you think about it, change is always all around us, but still one of the hardest things to accept. In our congregations, we are entering a time of change. Based on the recommendations from the Consolidation Task Force our councils will be considering what the next steps will be for our cooperative ministry. No matter what is decided, there will be plenty of change to go around. It may feel like our identity is slipping away. That can be very scary and sad. But that can also lead to exciting new beginnings.

This can mean:

- New opportunities to express God's love to the community around us.
- New ways to worship.
- New ways to work with and care for each other.

As we go through this season of change it will be very important for us to look to the future with hope and love. We will need to intentionally care for each other with kindness and compassion as we move forward to the next phase of our cooperative ministry.

Here at St. Peter's we continue to reach out to the community to offer support in whatever we can. We are always looking for ways to help wherever the need is.

MONTHLY FOOD BANK

Our new "shopping" food bank has been a huge success. We are averaging between 45–55 families each month (first Tuesday of each month from 3–6PM). They particularly like the drinks, cereal, mac and cheese, frozen goods, snacks, and canned goods. We would really appreciate if you could keep us in mind when grocery shopping. Every little bit helps. We are so grateful to Midwest Food Bank for their contributions.





MONDAY NIGHT MEALS

In addition to the Highspire United Methodist Church which helps every third Monday night, the Lower Swatara Lions Club is now helping every first Monday night. Our outreach to the community has thankfully included so many other service groups and we are very grateful.

We are averaging between 100 - 140 servings each Monday night. Our non-food items are very popular and we could use your help in donations of laundry detergent, paper towels, dishwashing soap (not

for dishwasher), tissues, cleaning supplies, and much more. Ask Sally for more information.

Right now we will start to accept Fall and Winter clothes. Any clothing is a true blessing. Please remember that in November and December we are planning on having a Christmas shop of gifts for our customers. Please consider donating anything you may have that would be suitable. (No books)

We are so blessed with MANY wonderful volunteers and especially the Midwest Food Bank. I am so thankful.

GOOD SAMARITAN BAGS

These bags are always available at both churches, St. Peter's and Trinity, in a basket in the narthex. Please help yourself and continue to reach out to serve the needy of our communities.

I hope you will continue to pray for our ministries. Please support us wherever you can.

Thursday Night Meals at Trinity

Thankfully, we are still able to continue our meal program on Thursday nights in Trinity's social hall. Over the past several years, the number of meals given out has grown.

Over the past year, we have continued to expand our services to those in need thanks to the help of Midwest Food Bank Pennsylvania located on Commerce Drive in Middletown. We are able to "shop" there every other week and all items that we pick out are free to us which is a blessing. We then bring all the items back to the social hall where we unpack them, decide which ones we will be able to use to make the meals, and then place the remainder on three 8' tables from which community members may shop when they come for meals. We also give out clothing and small household items that are given to us by congregational members.

Right now, we are NOT getting any meats or paper products from Midwest. (They are unable to get them from their suppliers!) **We are asking the congregation** to please consider helping out by donating canned meats (tuna, chicken, etc.), small jars of peanut butter, cans of soup and vegetables, paper towels, toilet paper, toothpaste, boxes of tissues, bars of soap, shampoo, small containers of hand soap, and any other products you might think of. Please label your box or bag with THURSDAY NIGHT MEALS and put them on the counter in the social hall.

If you are not able to go out and shop for these items, you may contribute to their purchase. Give your monetary donations to Jan or Ed Holwig. Right now, we are using monies from the Humanitarian Fund, the Fellowship Fund, Oktoberfest proceeds, and a donation from our membership.

If you can't shop for items or give a monetary gift but still wish to help, you can volunteer your time. Please talk to Jan, Sandy, Shelley, or Nancy to see how you can be involved.

The following people are to be commended for their dedication to making this program work: Shelley Radic, Nancy Paine, Judy Krovic, Jan & Ed Holwig, Sandy & Jim Canning, Matt Krovic, Zack Szekeres, and Matt Rissmiller. This is "the crew" that shows up on a weekly basis and makes it all work! Your congregation and the people of the community say, "THANK YOU!"



WHAT'S UP WITH HOMEBOUND MINISTRY?

As our congregations age, the number of people who have a need for homebound communion has grown. Pastor Liz met with Patrick and Jill Hawkins and Sally Schoenwolf to discuss how the needs of our homebound will be met, and what marks someone as homebound. Starting in July, the team will be bringing communion to members quarterly.

It is indeed helpful, right, and salutary to inform one of the visitors when you are in need of homebound communion or are no longer in need of homebound communion $\frac{1}{2}$.

In the month of August, two teens, Naryah Wright and Antoine Byers, from Steelton have been shot and killed in Harrisburg. 
