Letter to Trinity

Dear Barb and members of Trinity Lutheran Church.

On November 24, 2024, St. Peter's Lutheran Church held a special congregation meeting to vote on the recommendation from St. Peter's council to withdraw from the Renewed In Grace Cooperative ministry. After presentation of the recommendation and discussion, the vote of those members present was unanimous to withdraw from the cooperative ministry. Additional conversation confirmed St. Peter's desire to begin worshipping exclusively at St. Peter's in January 2025. This will give both congregations time to plan for that to occur.

According to our articles of agreement, we will notify Synod of this decision, and, this decision begins a 6-month period of separating the many areas that the two congregations have been sharing. It is St. Peter's intention during this transition to continue to live by the guidelines for the cooperative ministry which includes practicing kindness; being respectful of one another; praying for one another; speaking the truth and listening to one another in love; and supporting one another.

I pray that both congregations will continue to discern God's will for them and move forward trusting in God's abiding presence and love.

Letter from the Presidents

Time is going by fast, and fall is quickly turning to winter. We thought we would catch everyone up on what has happened since the last newsletter came out.

- **Highspire UMC:** Co-op Council was in discussions with Highspire UMC to see if there was a way we could help or partner with them. They made the heartbreaking decision to close. Their last worship was on November 3 (All Saints Sunday) and the building is closed to the public as of November 7. Our prayers are with them as their members go forward.
- **Recommendations from the Consolidation Task Force:** The Consolidation Task Force put together eight recommendations for the two congregational councils to consider. The recommendations were:
 - That weekly worship be held only at Highspire beginning October 27, 2024, Reformation Sunday at 10 AM, followed by weekly fellowship.
 - That the office be maintained at Trinity, forwarding all mail and phone calls to Trinity until the offices at the worship location are ready for moving to that location.
 - That the congregations merge under Trinity Lutheran's Constitution with assistance from the Synod.
 - That the treasurers of the congregations begin the process of combining funds and agree upon a software tracking system or engaging an outside bookkeeper with the intention of completing the process by Thanksgiving 2024.
 - That the office consolidates the rosters of the congregations.
 - Moving all service ministry to Highspire.
 - The Council of Trinity engage the services of a realtor to obtain a property assessment for Trinity and begin to consider the options for regifting or selling the property.
 - Weekly Christian Education be offered for adults and children with a projected start date of October 27, 2024, if all child protection policies are updated and requirements met, and teachers identified. *...continued on page 3*

Letter from the Presidents continued...

In a joint meeting on August 21, following spirited discussions the two councils approved the recommendations. Following this, both congregations had time to read and discuss the recommendations.

Based on the feedback from those discussions, St. Peter's Council voted to affirm the recommendations. Trinity's council, however, proposed that the co-op continue but without calling a pastor. Instead, they felt a chaplain would meet their needs better. Pastor Liz had made clear that when congregations seek a chaplain instead of a pastor, it is usually done when that congregation is preparing to close.

Following discussions, St. Peter's council discerned that Trinity has a vastly different vision of the future than St. Peter's does. As such, they recommended to their congregation that St. Peter's should leave the co-op.

St. Peter's voted on this at a special congregational meeting on November 24, 2024 (Christ the King Sunday). The vote of those members present was unanimous to withdraw from the cooperative ministry. Additional conversation confirmed St. Peter's desire to begin worshipping exclusively at St. Peter's in January 2025. This will give both congregations time to plan for that to occur. According to our articles of agreement, this decision begins a 6-month period of separating the many areas that the two congregations have been sharing.

Synod has been informed of St. Peter's decision. Pastor Jorgensen, the Director of Mission for Synod, has communicated that he will work with both congregations to help them determine their paths.

Since Co-op council is the body that is responsible for coordinating the joint efforts of the co-op, their focus now will be in coordinated the uncoupling of the Co-op. They will identify those areas where the congregations currently work jointly and will set a schedule of what decisions the two congregations will need to make to affect the separation.

When we began the journey which lead to forming Renewed in Grace, we didn't know what would happen and where we would go. We still don't know exactly what the future holds for our congregations. As the co-op ends, we hope that we can all remain siblings in Christ, encouraging and supporting each other in the future.

As we sometimes pray in worship:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ. Amen


